English

Maths

Lessons this term for will focus on:

Science

We will be learning about living things and their habitats, with a focus on animal food and diets. We will continue to classify animals according to what they eat and learn more about food chains. We shall also work scientifically when carrying out science investigations.

RE

Why does Christmas matter to Christians?

By the end of this unit, pupils will know that: -Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem. -The Bible points out that his birth showed

- he was extraordinary and that he came to bring good news
- Christians celebrate Jesus' birth; Advent for Christians is a time of getting ready for Jesus coming

Geography

Could a polar bear bear the desert or a camel cope in the cold?

Children will continue to develop competence at navigating a range of maps: google earth, atlases, globes and world maps. They will learn the names of all the continents, know more about living in a hot and cold place (e.g. Tromsø and Dubai) and be able to give examples of how location affects peoples lives.

Children will also be able to explain how and why animals have adapted to survive in different locations around the world.

Constructing a windmill

We will be exploring windmills, identifying their key features and constructing a model windmill.
