












EYFS Optional Challenge Projects - Autumn Term

These are suggestions for projects you may wish to complete with the help of an adult at home. If you wish to complete one or more of the activities, please bring it in to share by **Wednesday 17th December 2025**. We can't wait to see your ideas and creations!

<p>Ask a grown-up to help you find some old photos of where you live. What still looks the same? What has changed?</p> 	 <p>Can you use different materials or paint to make a picture of fireworks?</p>	<p>Talk to someone in your family about the kinds of jobs people do. Have you seen a bus driver, a shop assistant or a doctor? What do you know about their jobs and what would you like to find out? You could draw a picture of what job you would like to do when you are older.</p> 	<p>Find your favourite book. This could be a non-fiction or fiction book. Be ready to tell the class what it's about and why you like it.</p> 
<p>Find out about different kinds of jobs or work that people do in our local community. Are any of them affected by the weather? Do they have to work through the night?</p> 	<p>With a grown-up, go for a walk around your local area. Take some photos of the things you see. You could draw a map of your walk to show the different places you visit.</p> 	<p>With the help of an adult, cook a sweet or savoury dish by following a recipe. Take pictures of your method and delicious creations!</p> 	<p>Ask a grown-up to freeze some water to make ice cubes. Then, explore what happens as they melt. What do you notice? How can you make the ice cubes melt more quickly?</p> 
<p>Spend some time with an older relative or friend to talk about things they remember from when they were at school. Find out how school has changed since then. Tell them what it is like at your school now.</p> 	<p>Go on an Autumn leaf hunt. Can you identify the trees by looking at the shape of the leaves?</p> 	<p>With a grown-up, take a walk around an outside area, such as a garden or park. Draw pictures or take photos of some plants and animals that you see. Did you see any trees or flowers? Can you spot any birds? What else can you find?</p> 	<p>Talk about any festivals you celebrate with your family. What do you do to celebrate? Are there other festivals that you have talked about at school? Do any of your friends celebrate other festivals? What do you know about these celebrations?</p>
