(Colossians 3:12-14 New Living Translation)

Dear friends, this week, we enter into the particular holy season of Lent. I have chosen Paul's exhortation to the early Christian communities in Colossae to preface my newsletter because this is the time for our humble seeking of God's help to live as holy people. Paul's analogy of being clothed with those characteristics struck me because I thought, surely, they need to be infused and internal rather than

external and worn over our person. But Paul is right: these characteristics are dormant and actually of no use unless they are outward, visible, and known. 'Clothe yourselves with love' – those features are the fabric of love that connect ourselves with others, knitting relationships together with holiness.

So as Lent approaches and we move from Ash Wednesday into our time of penitence and renewal, let us seek God's help to be his holy people, unafraid and unashamed to express our faith in spirit and in truth.



ROYAL MAUNDY SERVICE at Durham Cathedral

We are delighted that the Royal Maundy Service is to take place at Durham Cathedral with Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla in attendance on **Thursday I7 April 2025**. Royal Maundy takes place each year on the Thursday before Easter Day and is a special service in which the King expresses his gratitude for those who serve and volunteer in their communities. The service is rooted in the tradition of Jesus washing his disciples' feet in the Upper Room the night before his death and goes back to medieval times. During the service His Majesty will present 152 recipients, 76 men and 76 women (signifying the age of the Monarch), with specially-minted Maundy money to thank them for their outstanding Christian service and for making a difference to the lives of people in their local communities. These recipients have been selected from the Diocese of Durham and other dioceses across the Province of York and from Wales and Scotland.

We are especially pleased that Gainford St Mary's Churchwarden and Vice-Chair Geoff Taylor has been selected to receive His Majesty's thanks with the presentation of Maundy money. It means a great deal to us that Christian service makes a positive difference to the lives of people in our communities. Well done Geoff for representing us all who endeavour to shine with Christ's light in the world.

Exodus 34:29-35

²⁹ Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. ³⁰ When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. ³² Afterwards all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. ³³ When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; ³⁴ but whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵ the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

The Gospel according to Luke (9:28-36)

²⁸ Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰ Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹ They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³² Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³ Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. ³⁴ While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
