YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION CHECK

MONDAY 2ND JUNE - FRIDAY 13TH JUNE

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for primary schools. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. Schools must administer the MTC to all eligible Year 4 pupils between Monday 2nd June and Friday 13th June. Please ensure your child brings in appropriate clothing for the weather, including a sun hat and sun cream – thank you.


YEAR 1 PHONIC SCREENING CHECK

WEEK COMMENCING 9TH JUNE

The Year 1 phonics screening check is not a formal test, but a way for teachers to ensure that children are making sufficient progress with their phonics skills to read words and that they are on track to become fluent readers who can enjoy reading for pleasure and for learning. The phonics screening check will be given to all Year 1 children in England during the week commencing 9th June 2025.

Please be aware that unauthorised absences on your child's attendance records could result in you receiving a penalty notice from the local authority.

5 days / 10 sessions unauthorised absence in a 10 week rolling period must now be referred for enforcement action. Parents who continually opt to pay the fine may face legal action.




Everybody has a taste for Stanley – and the other ocean creatures just keep mistaking him for a delicious treat – but this is no ordinary jellyfish.
