









# Oak Class Autumn Term 2024 Challenge Homework

All children in KS2 must complete at least one piece of the challenge homework. Our History theme this term is: 20<sup>th</sup> Century Migration and Geography topic is Migration. In Science this term we are covering Living things and their Habitats and Earth and Space. Have fun completing the challenges 😊

<p><b>Geography - Migration</b>  <b>Your story with migration</b>            Using a map of the world, discover where you, your parents, grandparents or other family members have migrated from. Find out why your family has migrated.</p> 	<p><b>Science – Life cycle posters</b></p>  <p>Create posters depicting the life cycles of humans and animals. You can use diagrams and illustrations to represent each stage.</p>	<p><b>History – Migration</b>            Try to name all the European countries that were once part of the Roman Empire. Can you explain how the Roman Empire changed the civilisation of these countries?</p> 
<p><b>Science – Planet Fact File Creation</b>            Using a digital tool such as PowerPoint, create a fact file for a chosen planet, including key information such as size, distance from the sun, and unique features.</p> 	<p><b>Art – Sonia Boyce Experiential Collage Creation</b>            Explore the concept of collage using mixed media by creating a collage that represents your identity, drawing inspiration from Sonia Boyce's themes of personal and cultural identity. Use various materials, such as magazines, fabric scraps, and natural elements.</p> 	<p><b>Science - Flower Dissection</b>            Gather flowers to dissect and explore the different parts (stamen, pistil, petals, sepals). You can draw diagrams and label the parts, explaining their roles in reproduction. Ensure that safety measures regarding tools are in place.</p> 
<p><b>Science/Art - Solar System Art Gallery</b>            Create artistic representations of each planet using various materials (paints, collage, or digital art software). We can turn the classroom an art gallery where you walk around, viewing and discussing each other's work.</p> 	<p><b>Be Creative</b>            Choose your own! 😊            Create your own challenge homework based on any topic we have covered or will be covering in school this term.</p> 	<p><b>Computing – Online Safety</b>            Create online safety posters suitable for the younger children in the school. They need to be clear and concise. Extra points for using the computer to create the poster.</p> 
<p><b>History - Historical Timeline Creation</b>            Research the timeline of invasions by the Romans, Saxons, and Vikings. Create a large poster that visually represents key dates, events, and reasons for the invasions.</p> 	<p><b>English -For or Against argument</b>            Based on our text 'Zoo' by Anthony Browne, can you write an argument either for or against animals being held in zoos.
