Speaking:

Children will start to...

Use simple sentences with 3-4 words. Talk about a range of different things. Use objects or gestures to help me explain what I mean when I am talking. Ask questions such as what, where and who. Begin to use word endings such as I am going. Use new words to describe what they are doing.

Listening

Children will start to...

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens.
- Pay attention to more than one thing at a time, which can be difficult.
- Use a wider range of vocabulary.
- Understand a question or instruction that has two parts, such as "Get your coat and wait at the door".

Core skills / Stability Skills

- Foot strengthening
- Shoulder girth stability exercises
- Body awareness exercises
- Movement from left to right
- Spatial awareness

Manipulative skills - finger gym area (threading, posting, flicking, picking up, using tweezers, pinching) simple ball games, large motor movements such as wavingribbons. Dressing toys

Locomotive Skills Parachute Games / simple flat obstacle course.

Children will also start to learn...

- -That people and other living things have needs and that they have responsibilities to meet them.
- -That they belong to various groups and communities such as family and school.
- -To help construct, and agree to follow, group and class rules and to understand how these rules help them.
- -To consider how they can contribute to the life of the classroom.
- -Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting and show more confidence in new social situations.

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating with materials: Draw using a range of materials, tools, and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

Literacy

Our core texts this term will be...

Phonics: Sound Discrimination Environmental Sounds, Phase phonics.

Reading Focus: 3-4 year olds will learn to turn pages in a book. Use role play or figures to help retell parts of a story. Fill in missing words when the adult reading stops. Explore books independently. They will identify their favourite rhymes and songs. Join in with favourite stories and join in with repetitive words or phrases. Know the missing words in stories and rhymes.

Maths

In their creative play, children will be

- Hear and say number names
- Begin to order number names
