# | Corinthians | 5: | - | |

<sup>1</sup> Now I should remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, <sup>2</sup> through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain.

<sup>3</sup> For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, <sup>4</sup> and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, <sup>5</sup> and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. <sup>6</sup> Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. <sup>7</sup> Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. <sup>8</sup> Last of all, as to someone untimely born, he appeared also to me. <sup>9</sup> For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <sup>10</sup> But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace towards me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. <sup>11</sup> Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

#### The Gospel according to Luke (5:1-11)

<sup>1</sup> Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, <sup>2</sup> he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. <sup>3</sup> He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. <sup>4</sup> When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' <sup>5</sup> Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.' <sup>6</sup> When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. <sup>7</sup> So they signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. <sup>8</sup> But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!' <sup>9</sup> For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; <sup>10</sup> and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.' <sup>11</sup> When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

# Stewardship: Praying for Wisdom to Manage Increased Responsibility

#### Scripture Readings:

• I Chronicles 4:10 – "Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, 'Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain.' And God granted his request."

• John 13:21-30 – The moment when Jesus identifies Judas as His betrayer at the Last Supper.

# Introduction: Be Careful What You Pray For!

Have you ever asked God for something and then thought, Wait...what have I done? Maybe you prayed for patience, and suddenly, you're stuck in traffic behind the slowest driver in the world. Or you asked God to help you grow in faith, and suddenly, life feels like an obstacle course!

Jabez prayed for an increase—more territory, more responsibility, more influence—and God said, Alright, here you go! But Jabez was smart—he didn't just ask for more, he asked for God's hand to guide him. Because, let's be honest, more blessings usually mean more stressings!

I. The Prayer of Jabez: "Lord, Increase My Territory (But Keep an Eye on Me!)"

Jabez prayed for three things:

- Blessing A holy "Yes, please!" to God's abundance.
- Enlarged Territory A bigger impact, but also bigger responsibilities.
- God's Hand and Protection Because managing more can get messy!

Imagine someone suddenly handing you the keys to a massive business or a huge church. You'd probably panic! (Where's the handbook? Do I get an assistant? Will there be snacks?) That's why Jabez added, "Lord, don't just give me more—stay close so I don't mess it up!"

# 2. Judas: The Man Who Mismanaged His Blessing

Now, let's contrast Jabez with Judas. Judas had a leadership role—he was literally the treasurer of Jesus' ministry. But instead of stewarding his responsibility wisely, he started skimming a little off the top. (Just a little... no one will notice!).

Then, in John 13, we see the ultimate moment of bad stewardship. Jesus, at the Last Supper, says, "One of you will betray me." Everyone starts whispering and looking around—probably thinking, "Hope it's not me!" Meanwhile, Judas is sitting there awkwardly, clutching his money bag, thinking, "Uh-oh, I think He knows!"

Jesus gives Judas a piece of bread, basically saying, "Go do what you've planned." And Judas... leaves. Into the night. Into history as the worst steward ever.

What's the lesson here? Stewardship isn't just about handling money—it's about handling responsibility well. Some people pray for a bigger role but forget to pray for the wisdom to manage it.

# 3. Stewardship Requires Prayer (and Maybe a Sense of Humour!)

If we want God to enlarge our territory, we need to pray like Jabez and avoid the mistakes of Judas.

• Pray for wisdom – Because increased responsibility without wisdom is like getting a new car without learning how to drive.

• Stay humble – Remember, stewardship is about serving, not controlling.

• Ask for help – Even Moses needed a team! No one succeeds alone (except maybe the guy who figured out how to turn water into coffee).

# Conclusion: A Faithful Steward's Prayer

Jabez prayed, and God blessed him. Judas mismanaged what he had and lost everything. If you're asking God to "enlarge your territory," make sure you also ask Him to enlarge your wisdom!

# So, let's pray:

"Lord, bless me indeed—but don't let me turn into a stressed-out mess! Give me wisdom to handle what You give me, grace when I stumble, and a sense of humor when things don't go as planned. And Lord... if you must give me more responsibility, at least let there be good coffee along the way. Amen!"
